Ross and Cromarty Heritage Society Maryburgh History

Brahan POW Camp 109



The site of the former camp can be found along the Maryburgh to Ullapool Road between the Tollie turn off and the north lodge.

During the second World War, a camp was founded in one of the home farm fields at Brahan for confining prisoners of war. It was used at different times for German and Italian prisoners

It comprised a guard camp and a fenced prison camp with recreation field. The land was according to Brahan Estate leased to the Ministry of Works from 1944 to 1957. The camp held Italian, German and other axis nationalities. The prisoners were delivered to local farms to help provide additional manpower.

Following the end of the Second World War the former PoW camp was repurposed as a Displaced Persons Camp and mostly held Ukrainians who, because they had fought on the axis side, could not return to the Ukraine which was then part of the Soviet Union, for fear of imprisonment or death. The UK government accommodated these former PoWs in old camps across the UK. The men were put to work in local farms and industries.

After which the camp was used for storing agricultural materials and equipment as well housing families and children for the potato harvest, until 1957 when the site was returned to Brahan Estate. Two concrete memorials were constructed at the entrance in 1949, one of which still survives

<u>MAC</u>

The MAC Board have received a Grant of £47,000 from The Highland Council to improve the Hall and the first task will be to sort the roof of the store which is leaking and requires to be fixed immediately - we have received a quote of £7000 to have the necessary work done. The portacabin outside the Hall is going to be removed but as the Wi-Fi connection is in this building this will be another bit of work to be done. I am sure you remember the fundraiser to raise money for CCTV cameras at the Hall and this is another task being costed now as at the end of last year there were several incidents of broken glass in the car park.

MAC Board has also been successful in obtaining a grant of £2500 to improve the dressing room facilities at the Hall which is very much needed.

The Board will sit and look at other ways to improve the hall for example heating/lighting, but I can assure you the money will be spent wisely and some of the professional people in the village could be approached for advice, which I hope you will assist us with.

The MAC Board are a new group of Board Members who are very positive in their approach to improving the facilities available, but without the support of the community this will be very hard to do.

I hope this information gives everyone a bit of insight to what is going on at the MAC meetings and what is planned in the coming months.
