

MAC Update November 2022

There's been a hive of activity at the Amenities Centre this month!

Thanks to funding from the Highland Council work on the store room roof has started and is just about complete. The board would like to thank those responsible for all the work carried out.

The Wi-Fi in the hall has been improved and the lighting around the outside of the Hall is being repaired just in time for the dark nights. The disabled toilet is up and running, and the renovation to the men's toilet almost complete, thank you to Andrew Steel for driving that forward.

MAC have worked in partnership with the Muir of Ord HUB this year to employ Gareth Meadows and Jade Skea the Village Operatives for Muir of Ord and Maryburgh. Funded by the Highland Councils Place Based Investment Fund the Green and Clean team have been working to maintain the green spaces in the 2 villages. They've been doing a fantastic job of clearing paths and keeping areas of the village tidy. Maryburgh Amenities Company (MAC) has successfully agreed to purchase the woodland between Birch Drive and Dunglass Road. This will ensure that the woodland will be kept in the community for the local people and future generations.

More information will follow but MAC will require assistance regarding management of the land going forward and we hope to receive the support of the Community.

A lot of work has been undertaken in a very short timescale to secure the purchase and thanks go out to members of the MAC board, members of Maryburgh Community Council, our local councillors and other parties.
