

The aims and objectives of this woodlands remain to be set though it is expected these will focus on:

- making the Woodland safe for members of the Community,
- maintaining accessibility for all members of our community,
- developing and implementing practices to protect and enhance the biodiversity of the Woodland.

Popular access point, opportunity to repair and upgrade signage.

Additional area of woodland, overgrown. Opportunity to improve resiliency.

TPO covering entire forest, felling and pruning requires Highland Council consent.

Hazardous trees identified. Opportunity to improve public safety through removal of hazards.

Red squirrels seasonally present. Opportunity to improve habitat conditions.

Popular access point, opportunity to repair and upgrade signage.

Inventory of gardens and designed landscape (Brahan Estate), mature specimen conifer trees showing signs of decline. Opportunity to preserve historic setting by replanting new specimen trees as future replacements.

Rhododendron bushes and other ornamental shrubs present on site. Opportunity to monitor extent and prevent future spread.

Popular access point, opportunity to repair and upgrade signage.

Regeneration of hemlock and beech at high density threatens long term resilience. Opportunity to thin out regenerating trees and underplant diverse species.

Core Paths connecting to longer routes. Opportunity to maintain path conditions to enable mobility scooter access.
